Pixie is recommended for home lawns, parks, athletic fields and golf courses. Pixie blends well with Kentucky bluegrass in ratios of 70% to 90% tall fescue by weight. Pixie can be planted at a rate of 6 to 12 pounds per 1,000 square feet. It is best planted in the fall -- at least 4 weeks before the first killing frost. Pixie is used in the A+ and Triple A blends.
